## Hopeful Preparation :::::

It is that time again – a time to prepare for Christmas. Everyone is busy shopping for Christmas gifts, decorations and parties. Most of conversation these days are about being prepared or not prepared for Christmas. You would hear many saying, “hasn’t the year gone fast?”, implying some kind of un-preparedness.

Jesus in today’s Gospel warns us to be prepared. In this Jesus invites us to think of a wider vision.

In Advent the Church reminds us that we people are living between two great events, the coming of Jesus as a child in Bethlehem and his second coming at the end of time. The first was in humility and obscurity, the second will be in power and glory.

One of the things that astonished most non-Christians in early centuries was the enduring hope of Christians as they looked forward to the return of Jesus. Their constant prayer was ‘Come Lord Jesus’. Just as the parable in today’s Gospel, early Christians were all prepared for the return of Jesus.

Hope is Faith that looks forward to the future. It’s opposite is despair, with its bitter fruits of cynicism, cold indifference, and sense of failure. Christian hope, therefore, is more than cheerful outlook. It is founded on a unique reality of the Resurrection of Jesus from the dead. Following the resurrection of Christ, Jesus’ followers also will resurrect. At his second coming on the last day, Jesus Christ will come in majesty to judge the world and establish the Kingdom in Glory. One might ask ‘when is the last day?’ Here we are dealing with heavenly reality where there is no time and space constraints. Therefore our language is inadequate to describe fully this reality. Nor can the human mind fully understand this reality. We can only pray, as we do everyday, “Thy Kingdom Come.”

On this First Sunday of Advent we are invited to think big and wider than just preparing to celebrate the humble birth of baby Jesus in Bethlehem. The message of Advent calls us to remember constantly that we live in the time between the first coming and the second coming of Jesus. Jesus foresaw our modern temptation to indifference and unbelief. Therefore he tells us to stay awake to the truth he spoke. In fact Jesus and his Church embodies the truth spoken by Jesus.

The return of Jesus is personal for us. We meet Jesus in a personal but unseen way in our reading and reflection of the Gospels. We meet Jesus personally in our prayer and in our Sacraments. Very specially Jesus returns in Holy Communion. But to meet Jesus at his return on the occasion of Sacraments, prayers, and spiritual reading of Gospels, we need to take away the obstacle of sin and scandals in personal life and in our faith community. Once we are prepared thus for the Glory of Jesus’ second coming, our meeting with Him will be full of joy. Our lives will be transformed with such a meeting with Christ.

Our Hope is cosmic as well as personal. Jesus, when he returns will transform you and me, and our world. That is why he asks us to watch and pray and keep our Christian Hope alive.

## Catholic Social Justice Timor Leste Friendship Group :::::

The Initial Parish meeting of the Catholic Social Justice Timor Leste Friendship Group held on Thursday 17<sup>th</sup> November.

Parishioners were able to get a good understanding of the history and relationship between Timor Leste and Australia. The hour length presentation by the MacKillop Sisters certainly highlighted the opportunities to assist our neighbour and why Australians have a particular obligation to help Timor Leste.

With a new school being built in our Friendship area of Hato Udo by Turramurra Rotary, we can help to fill out the needs of the school. It costs about \$750 per year to employ a local teacher. A very successful program of visits by Australian school teachers from Ballarat has assisted students in the adjoining area of Ainaro.

Medical supplies are also difficult to maintain. Cuba is well on its way to training 1,000 Timor Leste doctors. On our recent trip we met some of these doctors who are doing a great job. Volunteer Australian nurses, doctors and dentists spend regular tours in the country.

A number of small scale building, power and water projects have been undertaken by volunteer trades people.

Groups like Catholic Mission runs tours for both donors and students, providing an easy and organised introduction to Australians who want to learn more about the country. Travel time from Sydney is surprisingly short, about 5 hours flying plus a break in Darwin, and the cost is reasonable.

So, we are very lucky to be given this opportunity to better understand our friends at Hato Udo and hopefully the parish and the broader Catholic community and their friends will take up the opportunity. In 2012 lets move forward in getting to know our friends in Hato Udo.

## Laying of New Carpet in the Church :::::

### Request for Volunteers to Move the Pews.

Depending upon the delivery of the carpet from the England, it is proposed to commence laying the carpet in the main body of the church on Monday 5<sup>th</sup> December 2011 and to complete it by Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> December 2011. 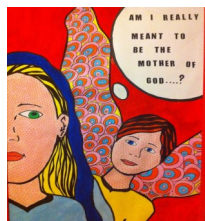

## Year of Grace 2012 :::::

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and from the Lord Jesus Christ. I am writing to you on behalf of all the Bishops of Australia, giving thanks to God for your faith and witness. We now share with you a message of hope.

We call the Catholic people in Australia to a **Year of Grace**, to span the time from Pentecost 2012 to Pentecost 2013. Like the disciples at the first Pentecost, we commit ourselves to **start afresh from Christ**.

For several years the Bishops have been reflecting deeply on the life of the Church in Australia. We have asked how we can better serve the needs of you, God's faithful people, in bringing the peace and good news of Jesus Christ to our nation. Pope Benedict XVI has also proclaimed a **Year of Faith** for the whole Church, to begin on 11 October 2012, the fiftieth anniversary of the beginning of the Second Vatican Council.

We are confident that, with grace leading to faith, and faith responding to grace, the Year of Faith and our Year of Grace will complement each other.

We recognise, firstly, God's abundant blessings to us. You will know many of these in your own lives. We have seen them, too, in large public celebrations such as World Youth Day in Sydney and the Canonisation of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop.

We also acknowledge with sadness that we are a Church in need of healing. There are many wounds – most especially the wounds of abuse which have left not only those abused but the whole Church in need of healing. There is also the struggle to defend the dignity of the first Australians and those who come as migrants and refugees to our shores. We need to extend the hand of friendship to those of other nations and faiths and to be good stewards of the created world. Most deeply, we desire for the light of Christ to burn more brightly in the heart of each Australian.

As Bishops, we asked ourselves where we can turn with so many issues confronting us. Our response in faith is to **start afresh from Christ**. We make this call, firstly and most urgently, to ourselves as Bishops. We are resolved, in the words of Pope John Paul II, to **contemplate the face of Christ**. Both these phrases come from his Apostolic Letter, *Novo Millennio Ineunte* (*At the Beginning of the New Millennium*), and we use this Letter as our guide and inspiration.

As we address this challenge to ourselves, we invite you to walk this journey with us in hope. We commit ourselves to pray daily, seeking the mind and heart of Jesus Christ. We commit ourselves to repent for the areas in which we have failed, individually and together, seeking healing and renewal through the grace of Christ's forgiveness. We commit ourselves to the path of holiness, cultivating the many gifts of the Spirit and seeking to grow as disciples of Jesus.

We entrust this year to the guidance of the Holy Spirit, and through this renewed commitment, we are confident that the Church in Australia will be transformed by the power of Christ's resurrection in our lives.

Planning has already begun in every diocese in the country, so that the Catholics of this nation may respond to this fresh invitation to "**contemplate the face of Christ**".

We invite you to join us in this journey of prayer so that this "Pentecost" year will be for our nation and all Australians truly a "year of grace".
