Weekly Reflection from our Parish Priest

Are you a hoarder or, do you have hoarding tendencies? Hoarding is a common psychological condition that has its origins in insecurity and personal fear.

People hoard all kinds of things, from shoes and clothes, to magazines, canned food, wine bottles and even stubs from movie tickets. Modern hoarding takes a slightly different dimension but is just as common - some people collect likes, followers, while others just collect and hold onto money at all costs. It doesn't really matter what is being collected it just seems that having a lot of it is somehow 'comforting'.

But hoarding has another dimension. It is not simply the collecting of items - it is also the inability to part with them. Hoarding is all about the individual person - about me, myself and I. All those things I've hoarded are *mine*, and they are not anyone else's.

This is why the final question of Jesus in the Gospel today is such a painful taunt to the hoarder: *and this hoard of yours, whose will it be then?*

Hoarding is not just a harmless affirmation of *self*, it is - consciously or unconsciously - a rejection of *others*.

Count the number of first person pronouns in these few lines from our Gospel:

"What am I to do? I have not enough room to store my crops... This is what I will do: I will pull down my barns and build bigger ones, and store all my grain and my goods in them, and I will say to my soul: My soul, you have plenty of good things laid by for many years to come; take things easy, eat, drink, have a good time."

For those who are proficient with grammar, you will notice that there are 11 uses of the 1st person: I and my. Even the word *you*, which is used only once, is directed to the self.

Tragically the hoarder of the gospel has become an icon of all hoarders (both young and old) who amass wealth for themselves, speaking of themselves without a genuine care for anyone else.

It is to the self-centredness of the hoarder that Jesus directs his cry of "Fool!"

Let us not forget that Jesus speaks this teaching, this warning, to all who live totally absorbed in the here-and-now, wrapped up in comfort of material illusions without any thought at all for God or for the plight of others.

Undoubtedly we all seek security - It's a natural instinct. We can all be people who are tempted to be afraid - even afraid of death, the ultimate source of insecurity. Jesus knows this about us and he knows of our tendency to grasp at anything which we suspect might make us feel less insecure about our future.

The more insecure the world becomes the more widespread the phenomenon of hoarding becomes. And it doesn't matter if what we collect is hundred dollar bills, cars, boats, antiques, likes or followers, it's still hoarding and it's still a waste of time. It might seem comforting to hoard, but these things will not and cannot make us safe in the future.

Real safety is assured only by making ourselves *rich in the sight of God*. To do this we are called and instructed to change our direction away from material things of this world to the things that will truly last for ever.

St Paul's advice is valuable: *...look for the things that are in heaven ...* Let your thoughts be on heavenly things, not on the things that are on the earth.

To this we may add the words of the Psalm: *Make us know the shortness of our life that we may gain wisdom of heart.*

Then we may rejoice with the alleluia verse: *Happy are the poor in spirit: the kingdom of heaven is theirs.*



**First reading: Ecclesiastes 1:2; 2:21-23 ::::**

What do people gain by all their work?

Vanity of vanities, the Preacher says. Vanity of vanities. All is vanity!

For so it is that a man who has laboured wisely, skilfully and successfully must leave what is his own to someone who has not toiled for it at all. This, too, is vanity and great injustice; for what does he gain for all the toil and strain that he has undergone under the sun? What of all his laborious days, his cares of office, his restless nights? This, too, is vanity.

The word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

Responsorial Psalm: Ps 89:3-6, 12-14, 17 ::::

R. In every age, O Lord, you have been our refuge.

You turn men back into dust and say: 'Go back, sons of men.' To your eyes a thousand years are like yesterday, come and gone, no more than a watch in the night. **R.**

You sweep men away like a dream, like grass which springs up in the morning. In the morning it springs up and flowers: by evening it withers and fades. **R.**

Second Reading: Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11 ::::

Seek the things that are above where Christ is.

Since you have been brought back to true life with Christ, you must look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is, sitting at God's right hand. Let your thoughts be on heavenly things, not on the things that are on the earth, because you have died, and now the life you have is hidden with Christ in God. But when Christ is revealed - and he is your life - you too will be revealed in all your glory with him.

That is why you must kill everything in you that belongs only to earthly life: fornication, impurity, guilty passion, evil desires and especially greed, which is the same thing as worshipping a false god; and never tell each other lies. You have stripped off your old behaviour with your old self, and you have put on a new self which will progress towards true knowledge the more it is renewed in the image of its creator; and, in that image there is no room for distinction between Greek and Jew, between the circumcised or the uncircumcised, or between barbarian and Scythian, slave and free man. There is only Christ: he is everything and he is in everything.

The word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

Gospel: Luke 12:13-21 ::::

To whom will all this wealth of yours go?

A man in the crowd said to Jesus, 'Master, tell my brother to give me a share of our inheritance.' 'My friend,' he replied 'who appointed me your judge, or the arbitrator of your claims?'

Then he said to them, 'Watch, and be on your guard against avarice of any kind, for a man's life is not made secure by what he owns, even when he has more than he needs.'

Then he told them a parable: 'There was once a rich man who, having a good harvest from his land, thought to himself, "What am I to, do? I have not enough room to store my crops." Then he said, "This is what I will do: I will pull down my barns and build bigger ones, and store all my grain and my goods in them, and I will say, to my soul: 'My soul, you have plenty of good things laid by for many years to come; take things easy, eat, drink, have a good time.' But God said to him, "Fool! This very night the demand will be made for your soul; and this hoard of yours, whose will it be then?" So it is when a man stores up treasure for himself in place of making himself rich in the sight of God.'

Help stop attempts to make abortion legal up until birth in NSW!!!

Earlier this week, the *Reproductive Health Care Reform Bill 2019 (Bill)* was tabled in NSW Parliament. If passed, it will make abortion legal up until birth in NSW, for any physical, psychological or social reasons, as long as two doctors agree.

There has been no community consultation on this Bill and no political party indicated that this Bill would be introduced during the State Election earlier this year. Attempts to rush the Bill through Parliament intentionally exclude the voices of all concerned citizens, including people of faith, from the debate.

Please act immediately to try and stop this Bill.

Please **urgently** contact our local NSW State Members of Parliament and ask them to vote against this Bill.

The local member for Cronulla is Mark Speakman MP and his electorate office is (02) 9527 1477, and the Member for Heathcote is Lee Evans MP (02) 9548 0144.

Simply phone the electorate office during business hours and let them know that you are from the local area, and would like to ask the Member to vote against the abortion bill.

The Catholic Church, through its many agencies, can provide support to women who feel they have no choice available to them other than abortion. If you know a woman experiencing difficulty because of an unexpected pregnancy, please know that there is help available. Thank you for your willingness to help in building a culture that protects and treasures all life in NSW!

Summary from Weekday Parishioner Meeting on Saturday 27 July

Parishioners gathered and had an opportunity to discuss the responses to the Survey of Weekday Mass attendees. It was agreed that weekday Masses in the chapel should be investigated and implemented in the not too distant future. Careful preparation will be undertaken in the next few weeks to prepare the space for weekday Mass and to gather further feedback from parishioners during the transition. There was a desire for a Marian image in the Chapel Space.

Music in the Parish was discussed, and it was agreed that music across the whole parish should be youthful while also reflecting our great Catholic tradition.

Participation of school children in parish committees was raised as an important priority, by listening, discerning and implementing together for the mission of Jesus.

The **Weekday Mass schedule** was discussed, with the acknowledgement that it is hard to find a priest replacement for 7am Masses when an assigned priest is away, and that maintaining the current schedule with one priest may result in burn-out, which it was agreed was not a good outcome for anyone. It was acknowledged that there is no easy answer, and that further reflection is needed. A desire for lay leadership with communion services and adoration was suggested. Further reflection, suggestions and feedback are encouraged.

There was also a strong desire for a **Parish Anointing Mass** for the sick and elderly to occur every 2 months on a Saturday morning.

Summary from Combined Meeting of Pastoral Council and Finance Committee on Tuesday 30 July

Fr James and Deacon John were both formally welcomed to the Parish by the combined gathered members. Members shared and reflected together on the question "Why do they come to Mass?"

The meeting then undertook a SWOT Analysis of the Parish, identifying and discussing the Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats to our parish community.

The meeting discussed the recommendation of

weekday parishioners to move weekday Masses to the chapel space, and it was agreed unanimously to support the recommendation and to implement in the coming weeks.

There was also a discussion about the weekday Mass schedule and it was agreed that it is desirable to have a weekday Mass celebrated at St Francis de Sales School on a weekly basis, and it was also agreed that the Parish Schedule will need to be considered so that burn-out will not occur.

The meeting also agreed to encourage Fr James in the implementation of a vision for the parish as suggested on the evangelical principles of joy, holiness and mission in the person of Jesus Christ.

Fr James proposed for consideration and reflection a new structure of lay involvement in the parish through the establishment of 3 Committees, formed and focussed around the three key missions of Christ through Worship, Formation and Being together in Good Times and Bad Times. The Meeting agreed to reflect on this proposed structure and to consult parishioners about wider parishioner involvement and the establishment of new sub-committees.

Fr James also announced that he is proposing to implement a new structure called the *Parish Team Leaders Meeting*, which will involve all clergy, lay employees and a rotational attendance from members of the pastoral council and the parish finance committee. The Meeting will occur every 3 to 4 weeks and will help with the day-to-day administration of the Parish and will seek to demystify parish administration by providing openness, transparency and collaboration in the decision-making processes.

The Combined Meeting attendees are looking forward to the Installation Mass of Fr James as the Parish Priest and encourage all parishioners and friends of the community to make a special effort to attend the installation and to pray for the renewal of the Parish.

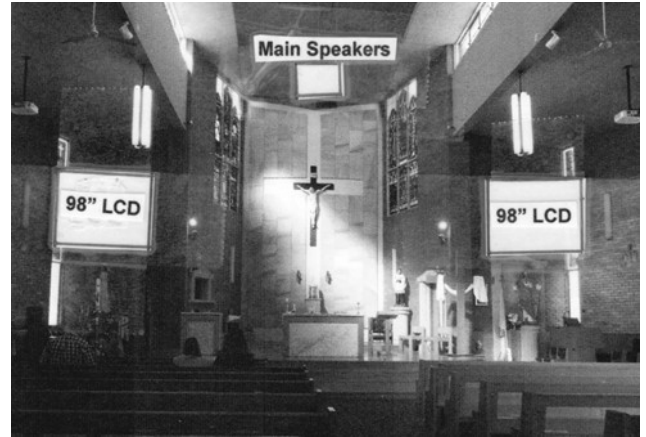

NSW My Community Project 2019 is a NSW Government Funding Program, inviting ideas from the community for projects to strengthen and enhance their local area. Applications for grants between \$20,000 and \$200,000 closed at 2.00pm on Wednesday 15th May 2019. A public vote of the residents of the local area is being used by the NSW Government to determine which projects are funded in each electorate.

On the 14th May 2019 an application for a \$128,000 Grant via the *NSW Government My Community Project 2019* was lodged on behalf of St Aloysius Parish in order to supply and install a complete new Audio and Visual System for St Aloysius Church.

Between the 15th May and the 15th July 2019, all applications were reviewed by the NSW Government for their eligibility and viability. On the 15th July 2019, a list of all successful Cronulla Electorate applicants, on which the public in our area can now vote, was published on the *My Community Project* voting website www.mycommunityproject.service.nsw.gov.au

GREAT NEWS!

St Aloysius Parish's application for a new audio/visual system is included in this list.

There are eighteen successful applicants in the Cronulla Electorate ranging in value from \$20,000 to \$200,000.

The final selection will be chosen by a voting system of the local electorate.

Voting opened on the 15th July and closes on 15th August 2019.

Who can vote for the projects?

- Anyone aged 16 years and over
- Must be resident in the Cronulla Electorate
- Must have a valid Medicare card

The Parish is competing against a variety of other schools and community projects.

Please ask your friends, your husband and wives, your children, your grandchildren, your parents and grandparents, your neighbours and even other people at the gym, at school or even the Nursing Home to vote.

TO VOTE ONLINE, people will need to either :

1. **Have a MYServiceNSW Account** (If you have done your rego for your car online, or receive other NSW Government grants, then you more than likely have an account already.)
2. **Register for a MYServiceNSW Account** at www.service.nsw.gov.au

All voters need to provide

- Their NSW residential address within the Cronulla Electorate
- Use their Medicare Card to verify their identity and age (this will also ensure each person can only vote once)
- A voter does not need a driver's licence and does not need to be on the electoral role.

Each voter has to short list between 3 and 5 projects of the 18 listed projects in order of preference.

Points will be allocated as follows:
